TOWN OF GARDNER AMENDMENT TO CAMPING ON PRIVATE PROPERTY ORDINANCE NO. (\(\sigmu\)_-2022

The Town Board of the Town of Gardner, Door County, Wisconsin, does ordain as follows:

Section 1 - Authority

This ordinance is adopted under authority granted by Wis. Stats. Sections 60.22, and Wisconsin Administrative Code section 327.06

Section 2 - Purpose

The purpose of this ordinance is to amend the existing Camping on Private Property Ordinance by adding provisions relating to penalties and enforcement, and clarifying the permit fees.

Section 3 - Repeal and Recreation

Section 6 and Section 7 of Ordinance No. 03-2021 is hereby repealed and recreated as follows:

Section 6 - Permit Fees.

 Fees for permits under the Camping on Private Property Ordinance shall be established by the Town Board of the Town of Gardner.

Section 7 - Penalties.

- Any person or entity in violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to written notice of violation to the property owner at or prior to the prosecution therefor.
- Continuing violation of this ordinance shall subject the person or entity in violation of the provisions of this ordinance to a forfeiture of not less than \$100 nor more than \$1,000 for each violation. Every day a violation continues shall be a separate offense. In addition, the Town Board may enforce this ordinance by Circuit Court action seeking penalties and injunctive relief. The person or entity deemed to be in violation shall be responsible for all reasonable costs and attorney fees incurred by the Town of Gardner in prosecution under this ordinance.
- 3. No new permits shall be issued until all previous violations have been corrected.

Section 4 - Effective Date

This ordinance shall be effective the day after its publication.
